In April 2006 IJSI Director, Professor Gary Cordner, along with Professor Kay Scarborough and Mr. Andy Gembara of G&H International



Services Inc. visited Kiev for meetings with the Ministry of Internal Affairs of Ukraine, the University of the Ministry of Internal Affairs, and the IAAC - International Anticriminal and Antiterrorist Committee of Ukraine. Discussions were also held with representatives from the Computer Crime Research Center based in Ukraine. The visit was hosted by Oleksiy Chistyakov, retired Police General and Deputy Minister. EKU visited Ukraine twice

before the orange revolution. In August 2000 Gary Cordner joined Dennis Kenney from the Police Executive Research Forum

Ministry of Interior, Republic of Kazakhstan Visits ECU for Education & Training July 15-28, 2006

On July 15 fourteen Kazakh Police representatives visited Richmond, Kentucky for education and training at the College of Justice and Safety of Eastern Kentucky University and the Kentucky Department of Criminal Justice Training (police academy). They were welcomed by Gary Cordner, IJSI Director, and Andrew Gembara, President of G&H International Services Inc. The Kazakh Police Delegation leader was Sultan Kusev, Deputy Chairman Criminal Police Committee. Other representatives included officials from the Ministry of Interior of Kazakhstan, Criminal Police, Special Forces Department "Sunkar" of the Ministry of Interior, etc. Although their visit lasted only two weeks, they had a very busy schedule in Richmond, Lexington, Bowling Green and Northern Kentucky. The training included visits to the police academy, prosecution, courts, jail and several police departments.

Kazakh police officials also had an opportunity to take classes taught by Gary Cordner, Cindy Shain, Ed Brodt, and others, on such topics as U.S. Policing, Gangs, Terrorism, Community Policing, Police Operations, Police Management, Police Training, Police Ethics & Integrity, and Problem-Oriented Policing & Crime Prevention. Kazakh Police representatives also had an opportunity to share their experience and knowledge, as well as ask questions on topics that were not covered during the lectures.

Although the schedule was very busy, Kazakh officials also had time to go visit a baseball game, shopping malls, Mammoth Cave National Park, and other Kentucky sights. On July 26 Kazakh police accompanied by Gary Cordner also attended a national police conference in Lexington (Commission on Accreditation of Law Enforcement Agencies) and Banquet at Arlington House (EKU). Overall Kazakh Police officials were very satisfied with the quality and the amount of information and experience they had gained.

The only complaints raised were about the busy schedule and an American food. In the end, they were very interested in the continuing friendship and collaboration with the G&H International Services Inc., and the Eastern Kentucky University.
